

<u>Activities of the Social Rights Committee (Oct 2023 – Dec 2024)</u> <u>Workshops and Meetings:</u>

Feb 11, 2024 – Consultative Workshop with Students from New Giza University (Faculty of Medicine):

• Focused on human rights, particularly health and reproductive rights. Key recommendations included revising the human rights curriculum, developing a student-led action plan, producing awareness materials, and preparing student trainers.

Feb 27, 2024 – Expert Consultative Meeting on Reproductive Health and Rights:

 Recommendations included establishing an independent population authority, improving family planning governance, expanding services to rural areas, and integrating reproductive health in education.

May 17, 2024 – Workshop with New Giza University Students:

Focused on reviewing reproductive health curricula and using short videos for awareness.

Dec 21, 2024 – Roundtable on Medical Liability Law:

• Participants emphasized the need to balance patient and doctor rights, recommending review of international legal experiences and proposing consensus-based legal provisions.

Field Visits:

Oct 16, 2023 – Visit to Giza Childcare Institutions:

 Recommendations: expedite school enrollment, increase psychological and medical support, improve infrastructure, and prioritize children in conflict with the law or without shelter.

Oct 23, 2023 – Visit to Marg Juvenile Institution:

 Recommendations: enhance post-release support, conduct medical screenings, expand training workshops, improve communication rights, and boost educational services.



Nov 29, 2023 – Visit to Universal Health Insurance System in Luxor:

Commended existing efforts and called for accelerated rollout in remaining governorates.

Feb 14, 2024 – Visit to Imbaba Addiction Treatment Center:

- Recommendations: pass legislation for addiction centers, expand awareness campaigns, replicate the center's model nationwide, and support post-recovery integration.
- Interactive Engagements with International Stakeholders: Ongoing (2023–2025): Active
 participation in interactive sessions led by the GANHRI (Global Alliance for National
 Human Rights Institutions) aimed at drafting an international convention on the rights of
 older persons.
